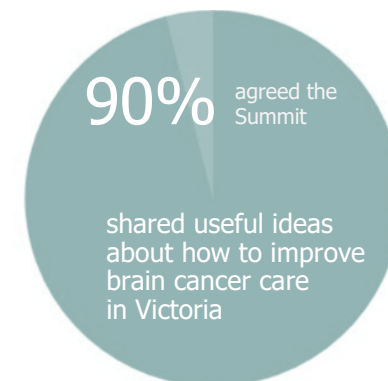
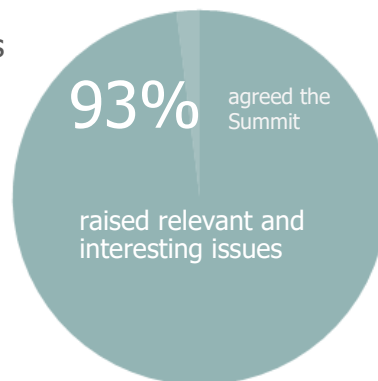


Victorian Tumour Summits

**100%** thought consumer perspectives provided an understanding of patient and carer experience with brain cancer care in Victoria



Overall...great, well presented session/s. Use of technology was good and the structure was well designed.

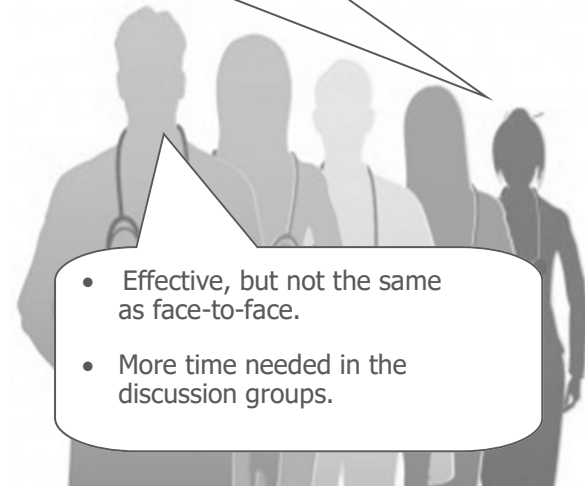
The consumers gave an excellent overview and the video worked well for them to communicate issues very clearly – however, I feel like there is also a story from consumers who have more significant impairment and much worse prognosis.

The virtual meeting allows more time for discussion, which I haven't experienced when attending in person because people are more mindful about giving everyone a chance to voice their opinion.

Whilst I think that the team did well to deliver the Summit in an online format, I don't think it is a good way to conduct summits generally, as important collegiate interaction cannot occur via this methodology.
